## FREE TRAINING FOR IN-DEMAND HEALTHCARE JOBS FOR UNDER- OR UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS

This spring, New York Tech's Healthcare Service Training Initiative is offering tuition-free training courses to under- or unemployed New York State residents, people diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder, and veterans. Thanks to a grant provided by the New York Department of Labor and a great need to fill important jobs in the healthcare sector on Long Island, New York Tech is now offering five certificate training programs. The training programs are offered FREE of charge because of the funding from the New York State Department of Labor.

### OUR FREE TRAINING PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

**Basic Life Support** (4 hours): March 15 or April 6 (5 – 9 p.m.) \$50 FREE

**Medical Coding** (60 hours): Tuesdays and Thursdays (5 – 9 p.m.), begins March 1 \$700 FREE

**Personal Trainer** (58 hours): Mondays and Wednesdays (3:30 – 5:45 p.m.), begins March 2 \$990 FREE

**Rehabilitation Aide** (90 hours): Saturdays and Sundays (9:30 – 5 p.m.), begins March 5 \$1,400 FREE

**Health Care Aide with Gerontology Specialization** (50 hours): Mondays and Fridays (6 – 9 p.m.), begins March 7 \$600 FREE

*(Note: additional hours will be required for the Home Health Care Aide New York State certification)*
